Hairdressing

Hairdressing Apprentices put together a stand in the Images Salon reception, giving customers advice on general hair care and styling products.



Motor Vehicle

Motor Vehicle Apprentices conducted winter vehicle checks in the Car Care Centre. Apprentices used safe working practices to check a variety of cars to ensure they were safe to be on the roads during the winter season. Advice was provided to the customer if any of the cars needed attention.



Plumbing

Plumbing Apprentices provided a demonstration and a practical opportunity for staff to learn how to safely remove a radiator, flush it out, vent, re-charge, re-fill and replace the radiator.

Apprentices prepared the area using good housekeeping to protect the customer's homes, they then isolated the radiators, removed them from the wall, re-fitted and vented and then balanced the radiators using the control valves.



Business Administration

Business Administration Apprentices took the lead to present a talk to learners interested in undertaking a Business Administration Apprenticeship.
