STUDENT BRINGS CHILDREN'S STORYTELLER'S CHARACTERS TO LIFE

Art Student, Matt Benson sketched a number of images for a new book written by local author Peter Asher.

Just a few months ago, Poorly Boy, the main character in the book, was just an image in the reader's head. But, thanks to the talented student, Poorly Boy now has a face and friends to match his adventures.

Mr Asher now wants to work closely with the student to develop his characters further. Matt, who was studying for a BTEC National Diploma in Design, said he was delighted with the news. He said: "It feels good to have my work chosen, but it was quite surprising because there were four of us who had good drawings."

Matt's drawings are not particularly traditional. He uses hand-drawing techniques, as well as an IT package to visualise his characters.

He added: "I enjoyed the project because this is the type of work I want to do when I go to university. I am interested in illustrating and animation."

His work was chosen to illustrate the story after judges felt Matt's images highlighted the mannerisms of the characters.

This is the second time the youngster's work had been chosen to be used to print. He also designed last year's Appleby-Frodingam Gala's mug. But the youngster's latest project could earn him some cash in royalties if his art work is printed. He added: "I am looking forward to working with Mr Asher on the other characters in his book."

Mr Asher was advised to find an illustrator who could bring out the personality of his characters, so he contacted North Lindsey College design students for their help.

Angie Hodgson, curriculum area manager at the College, was pleased the design department had been asked to be involved with the project. She added: "I am delighted Matt's work was selected as he intends to study illustration at Derby University and this provides him with an opportunity to see his work in print."

She said Mr Asher was currently writing a new set of stories featuring a family of dysfunctional squirrels called the ratatoks. It is planned the author will be working with the College's students again next year – but this time to translate his stories into a short animated film enlisting the help of BTEC National Diploma in Multi-Media students.

A partnership in Scunthorpe has led to dozens of workers gaining new qualifications.

And, to mark the success, a celebration was held at North Lindsey College Outreach Centre based at the 2 Sisters company premises on the Foxhills estate.

The event was held after the College, in partnership with 2 Sisters, had 100 learners achieve a full NVQ2 in Performing Manufacturing Operations.

North Lindsey College principal Dr Roger Bennett, who presented certificates to some of the learners, said the event demonstrated to the learners and their colleagues the importance attached to their achievement.

And he said "I think it's a great partnership that we have here." Dr Bennett said the initiative had been a complete success and he told the learners: "I applaud each and every one of you."

The majority of the study is based and/or assessed in the work situation. Dr Bennett recognised the learners had succeed while also managing work and other commitments.

Many of the learners attend North Lindsey's Outreach Centre either just before or after their shift for additional learning, such as IT skills or English.

Pete Wood, Business Unit Development manager at 2 Sisters, said it was good for employees to have on-site facilities and for there to be an opportunity to build a relationship with North Lindsey College for the future.

Phil Crane, work-based learning and assessment officer based at the Outreach Centre at 2 Sisters, said "It has surprised even me, the motivation of the staff to learn."

The hope was also expressed that for the successful candidates, their experience would not be the end of their learning.
